Call for Papers The 7th Annual Conference of the Geolinguistic Society of Japan

Date: May 24, 2025

Venue: Takushoku University Bunkyō Campus (The detailed location of the venue is noted in the program that will be available in late April.) 3-4-14, Kohinata, Bunkyō-ku, Tokyo, 112-8585, Japan

Format: Hybrid (In-person / Online)

Language: Japanese or English

- **Scope:** A requirement for acceptance comprises the inclusion of feature maps of individual linguistic properties from languages around the world. The main content should be a discussion of the formation process of individual language features in terms of their geographical distribution, using symbols that classify them. Symbols can only be distinguished by five colors, so if there are more than five colors, please change the shape and size of the symbols. Additionally, the types of other papers that will also be accepted include papers including glottograms, figures, or graphs with geographical focuses; papers on dialect demarcation provided the maps of an individual linguistic feature are included; papers on names of places and families provided the maps are included; and papers in sociolinguistics, human geography, or natural geography provided they are combined with maps of linguistic features (which could be already published). The type of papers that will not be accepted comprise descriptions of a dialect or dialects, comparison of dialects, and nonacademic papers.
- **Membership:** We have no membership system. Application to participate in the conference is open for all. Although this is a domestic society, scholars from outside Japan are also welcomed. The society and the host institution cannot offer any assistance with visa applications or offer any special service to the participants. This is the responsibility of the participants.
- How to apply: Send your abstract (a Word file or a PDF file) to <u>gsjtaikai2025@gmail.com</u> from March 22 to 31, 2025. The language used in the presentation must also be used to write the abstract. The abstract will be printed as it is when accepted, so it must be proofread by a native

speaker when it is not written in your native language. The length should be <u>within two pages</u> of an A4 size; the margins should be 30 mm; and the font size should be 11-point, with 40 lines to a page. The title should be centered on the first line, and a subtitle can run up to two lines. After one line space, your name, followed by your affiliation in parentheses, should be centered. The body text should begin following another line space. At least one linguistic feature map or a figure with a geographical focus must be included. Any paper without such a map or figure will not be accepted. The sample maps must be copyrighted so that there will be no problem in public transmission. The length must not be more than two page including a map or a figure. The abovementioned layout must not be altered. No header or footer including a page number should be added. <u>Only Unicode fonts may be used. IPAs should be printed using Times New Roman. Never use SIL or other additional fonts except Unicode. PDF files should be saved while embedding the appropriate font into the document.</u>

- **Notification of acceptance:** When the abstract is received, an automated acknowledgment is sent. The selection result will be published on the society web page https://geolinguistics.sakura.ne.jp/index.html by <u>April 24, 2025</u>. There will be no personal correspondence involved.
- **Abstracts:** A PDF version of the abstracts will be uploaded to zenodo, which complies with Creative Commons Ver. 4, and a DOI will be provided and a link to it will be published on the conference website. Please note that upon submission, you are granting the society permission to exercise the right of public transmission. Since the submitted abstract is not deemed a formal paper, the author is permitted to submit a full version of the paper written based on it to any academic publication.

Duration: Presentation = 20 minutes. Q&A = 10 minutes.

*In the case of co-authorship, the first author must be responsible for all or part of the presentation. The second and subsequent authors are free to present.
